

5 THINGS TO ASK YOUR CANDIDATES ABOUT THE ENVIRONMENT

The next BC election, scheduled for **October 19**, has huge implications for the environment and climate. Every candidate running for a seat in the Legislature needs to know these are issues we'll be voting on, and we can all ask our candidates where they stand. At public events, pre-election campaign debates, and over the phone or via email, please ask your candidates:

1. If you became part of the BC government, would you honour or walk away from the last government's promise to save old-growth forests?
2. Do you support the expansion of the fossil fuel industry despite the fact pollution from fracking and LNG is already fuelling climate disasters all over BC?
3. If your party forms government, will it protect 30% of lands and waters in BC by 2030, and pass legislation to protect species at risk?
4. If elected to government, will you support or oppose the continued spraying of glyphosate (Round up) and other toxic herbicides over tens of thousands of hectares of forests in BC?
5. Will you commit to protecting the critical habitat of the northern spotted owl, the most endangered species in BC, in compliance with the federal government's recovery strategy?
